The current health pandemic has necessitated substantial changes in our lives, including our worship services and other programs at Mount Pisgah Baptist Church. All services and programs have been suspended until further notice. However, the Trustee Ministry has collaborated with the church leadership and other ministries to ensure that the church continues to engage and minister to all our members as best we can under the circumstances. Specifically, the pastor is providing inspirational messages through our Phone Tree, the Deacons Ministry is calling members with encouragement and offering assistance, and the Trustees are working to ensure that the church financial obligations are met.

Tidbits:

- On January 20th, Mt. Pisgah was the host of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day with the theme, "The Fight is Real." The speaker for the occasion was Reverend Charcey Priester, pastor of St. Paul Baptist Church.
- On February 14th, Ward Three held their annual Valentine's dinner at Mt. Pisgah. The theme was, "Sharing Christian Love." Deacon Walter Williams is the president of Ward Three.

A letter from the pastor to all members outlined the efforts undertaken by the church leadership to enhance our weekly radio ministry that is broadcast on WSPX (94.5 FM) radio Sundays at 2 p.m., as well as some live appearances on Ole Skool (102.9). With assistance from the Media Ministry, the pastor has been able to provide more-timely presentations of sermons on our website, as well as on the website of the Times and Democrat, our local newspaper, which is broadcasting area churches' weekly sermons.




YOUTH NEWS

Check it out! Watch out for scams related to Economic Impact Payments

The IRS urges taxpayers to be on the lookout for scams related to the Economic Impact Payments. To use the new app or get information, taxpayers should visit IRS.gov. People should watch out for scams using email, phone calls or texts related to the payments. Be careful and cautious: The IRS will not send unsolicited electronic communications asking people to open attachments, visit a website or share personal or financial information. Remember, go directly and solely to IRS.gov for official information. The IRS will post frequently asked questions on IRS.gov/coronavirus and will provide updates as soon as they are available.

If you are a registered voter in South Carolina, you may be eligible to vote by absentee ballot. If you qualify, an application for absentee ballot may be requested any time after January 1st during the election year. This is done by contacting your County Voter Registration Office in person, by mail, or by telephone.
