Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church 2018 Women Honorees





Black History Month Events

The late Deacon Robert S. Evans and Deaconess Beatrice Evans were recently honored for years of service by Ward Four during Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church's Black History Month Celebration. Deacon Evans joined Mt. Pisgah in 1941 and served faithfully and diligently for more than 60 years. He was active in numerous church organizations and he also played a major role in the implementation of Mt. Pisgah's dining services. Deacon Evans was a graduate of then South Carolina State College and starred on the football team and later served as food service director, a position he was appointed to in 1964. He is in the SCSU Athletic Hall of Fame and the Robert S. Evans Walnut Room was named in his honor.

Deaconess Beatrice Evans has been a dedicated and faithful member of Mt. Pisgah for more than 60 years. She continues to support the church and its many endeavors. Mrs. Evans was the first president of the Orthodox Baptist Women Missionary Association and the Harvest Tea Rally, held offices in the Deaconess Ministry, a member of the Women's Guild Executive Board and an active member of Ward Four. She also previously served as president of the Baptist Training Union, and is still active in the Floral Ministry. Mrs. Evans has also been active in her community and is a member of many organizations, including Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Orangeburg Chapter Links, Inc., and the NAACP. SCSU Forum Honors Legacy of Dr. Payton

The legendary Dr. Benjamin Franklin Payton was posthumously honored by fellow alumni of South Carolina State University and dignitaries from across the state on the Orangeburg campus February 9th and 10th. The forum highlighted Payton's rise to leadership, focusing on his educational achievements. Following his highly successful tenure as President of Benedict College, he went on to become the illustrious fifth President of Tuskegee University. Resolutions honoring Payton included presentations by state Senator John Matthews and Representative Jerry Govan on behalf of the South Carolina Senate and House. Several members of Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church attended the forum in support. Dr. Payton was the son of the late Mrs. Sarah Payton.

Jamerson-Holmes, Williams Honored at Gala

Orangeburg has a rich history of producing Black entrepreneurs. On Saturday, February 17, 2018, the Carolina Panorama newspaper hosted the 2018 Legacy of Black Business Gala at the Premiere. The event was designed to honor African-American businesses in Orangeburg that have served the community for at least 25 years. Thirteen businesses were honored. Among these was Rachelle's Island which was the youngest business honored and Cecil Williams Photography. Williams is the husband of Barbara Williams.

Church Hosts Health Initiative

Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church served as host for the Orangeburg NAACP Dialysis Initiative for Access, Choice and Equality. The learning session dealt with the prevention and treatment of kidney disease. It provided access to local services and dialysis therapies. Speakers for the event were Dr. Hakmei, a nephrologist; Mr. Nathaniel McMillan, a representative of PACE and Mr. Mark Walker, a two time kidney transplant patient. Mrs. Barbara Williams, president of the Orangeburg NAACP served as mistress of ceremony. The workshop held on January 23rd was very informative.

Trustees' Corner

The Trustee Ministry continues to address the upkeep of church property and facilities, to address safety issues and oversee the church funds. During the March 26 quarterly church meeting, Trustee Ministry Chairman Leroy Morant shared with church members the need to address needed repairs and other safety issues. Those present voted to approve the repairs and funding for them.

The repairs – which included among other things – improving the sidewalks and insuring they are handicap assessable, re-designing the entrance to the Educational Building including replacing the overhead awning, upgrading of steps to entrances at choir stand and from the Educational Building to church, and replacing designated gate entrances and rails.

These improvements, which got underway shortly after the conference meeting, will bring all of our entrances and egresses into compliance with handicap regulations and other fire marshal concerns. (Continued on p. 3, see Trustee Ministry.)
